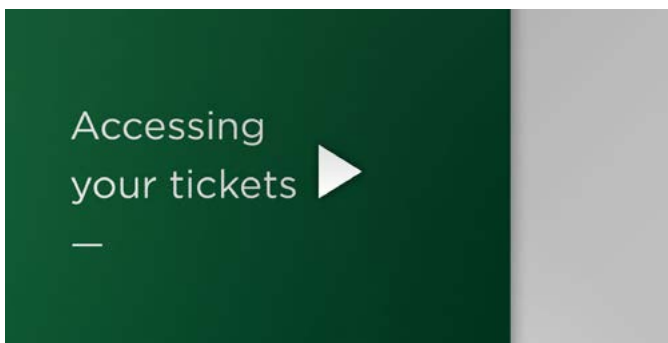
The Grounds can be crowded and you may have to queue, so allow plenty of time to move around.





YOUR TICKETS

- Debenture tickets are for the court specified on the date shown and entitle the ticket holder to entrance to that court and not to view a particular match or round of matches or individual players.
- Matches may move from one court to another at the discretion of the AELTC. See full Terms and Conditions [here](#).
- Have your mobile ticket ready in the Wimbledon App along with photo ID for entry.
- The QR code on your mobile ticket will be active from 7am on the morning of the day you are attending.

TICKET RESOLUTION POINT

- The debenture ticket holders' resolution point is located at Gate 3 on Church Road.
- Please head there if you encounter any issues with your mobile ticket upon arrival at the Grounds.

ARRIVAL GATE

All debenture ticket holders are encouraged to use Gate 4 on Church Road.

DEBENTURE AREAS ACCESS

- Centre Court debenture ticket holders have access to the Centre Court debenture bars and restaurants and The Renshaw restaurant located in No.1 Court.
- No.1 Court debenture ticket holders have access to the No.1 Court debenture bars and restaurants.

CHILDREN

A day at Wimbledon is an exciting and memorable experience. Please read the following if you are thinking of bringing young people with you:

- Whilst we don't recommend bringing babies and infants, a ticket is not required for those under five. However, children under five are not allowed into the Show Courts (Centre, No.1, No.2, No.3, Court 12, Court 18).
- Children over five and under 16 are welcome, provided they are accompanied by an adult at all times and have their own seat.

CONTACTLESS PAYMENT

This is a cashless event, so please bring your credit or debit card or other form of cashless payment.

TRAVEL

PUBLIC TRANSPORT

Please plan your journey and allow plenty of time to reach the Grounds. Public transport and roads around the Grounds may be heavily congested.

Please use the [TfL Journey Planner](#) to choose the best mode of transport. Check train journey times for Wimbledon Station [here](#).

-  Southfields Station (District Line) - a 20 minute walk to the Grounds.
-  Wimbledon Station (District Line/South Western Railway/London Trams) - a 25 minute walk to the Grounds. Please note this route involves a steep hill.
-  Wimbledon Park Station (District Line) - a 25 minute walk to the Grounds.
-  There is a dedicated Championships bus service from Wimbledon station going to and from the Grounds during the event. Single fare £3.50, return fair £5.00. Return buses leave from outside Gate 11 on Somerset Road (exit the Grounds through Gates 12 or 13). Please note the 493 TfL bus service does not stop outside the Grounds during The Championships.

CHURCH ROAD CLOSURE

Please note that Church Road remains partially closed for the duration of The Championships. This may affect how you approach the Grounds if travelling by taxi, private car or if parking. Please familiarise yourself with the changes and remember to pass the information on to friends, family and guests. View the Wider Connections Map [here](#).

TAXI & DROP-OFF

- Wimbledon Station: taxis drop off at the bottom of Marrayat Road close to Gates 12 and 13.
- Southfields Station: taxis for the Grounds depart from the rank in Augustus Road adjacent to the station and drop off inside Car Park 8.
- Ride sharing apps must use the designated drop-off areas located on Maryatt Road and Victoria Road. Please note that Uber, Bolt cars etc. cannot pass through the Church Road closure.





PRIVATE TAXIS & CHAUFFEUR CARS

- Due to the partial closure of Church Road, the arrival experience has changed.
- In the morning all private taxis and chauffeur cars should approach the site from the south (from Wimbledon).
- Please request a digital Temporary Access Pass from The AA in advance to gain access through the road closure for drop off near to the Guest Arrival Hub in Car Park 5.
- This will be emailed to you and must be shown on arrival to allow the vehicle past the road closure and directly to the Guest Arrival Hub in Car Park 5.
- Please note this pass does not entitle the holder to park. Once drop-off has taken place the driver must exit by Car Park 8, north on to Church Road.

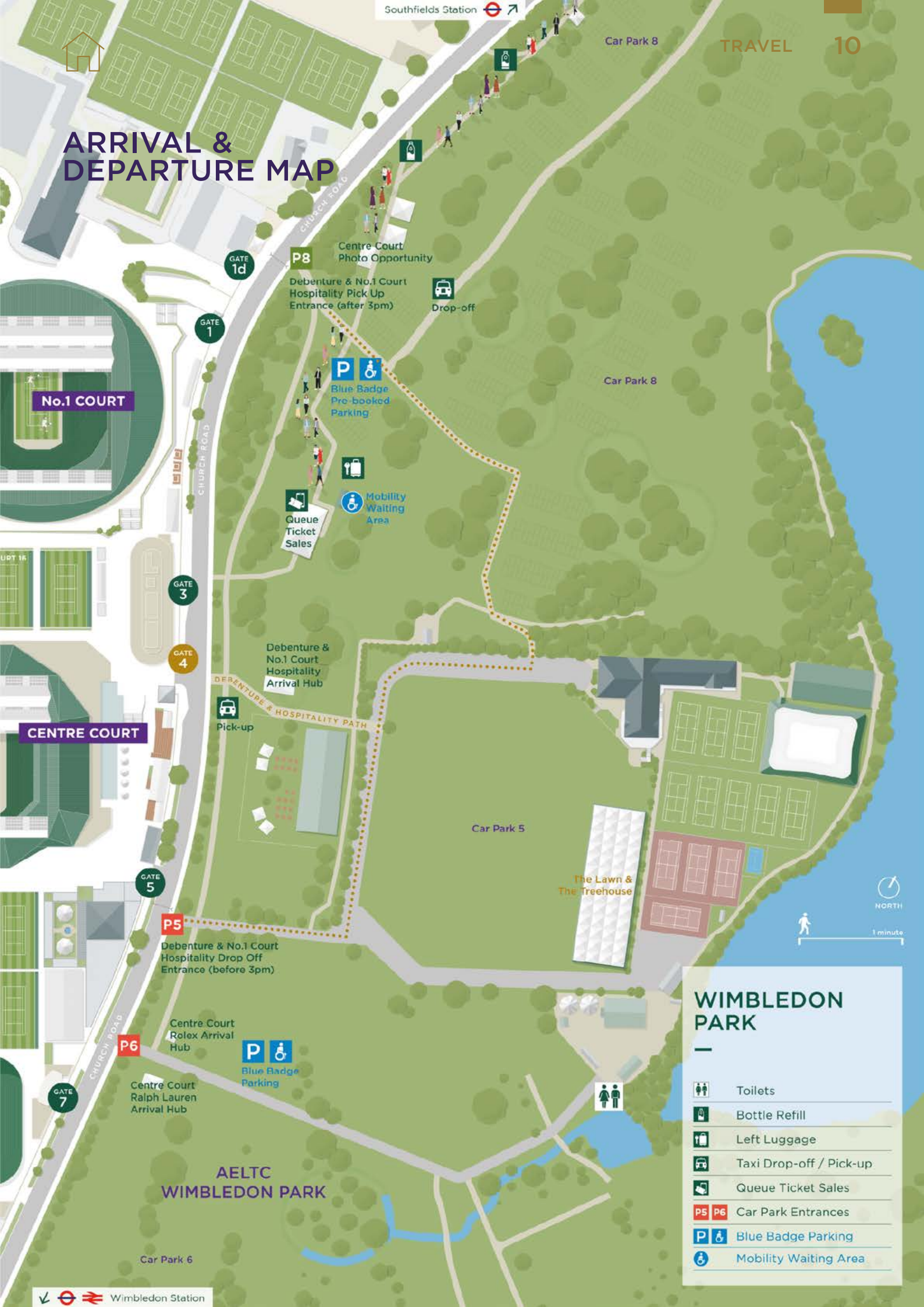

PARKING

- Car Park 5 is available for registered debenture holders this year.
- Car Park 6 is available for all ticket holders and can be pre-booked.
- Motorcycle and minibus parking is also available in Car Park 6.

Bookings can be made throughout The Championships by calling The AA Wimbledon Parking booking line on 03300 413677. Booking lines are open from Monday to Friday 9am–5pm.

Due to the temporary closure of Church Road this year, please follow the signposted routes that correspond to the colour of your parking pass rather than relying on sat nav directions. Car Park 5 and 6 have red passes.

GUEST ARRIVAL HUB

Debenture Hosts are located at the Guest Arrival Hub to answer any questions. Seating, a toilet and light refreshments are also available.

BLUE BADGE PARKING

- An area within Car Park 5 is available for registered debenture holders with blue badges.
- An area within Car Park 6 is available for all other blue badge holders.
- Blue Badge drop-off points are available opposite Gate 13 on Somerset Road.

MOBILITY SHUTTLE

A buggy shuttle service operates from Car Park 5 to transport those in need of mobility assistance to Gate 4.

Upon leaving the Grounds, please ask the cloakroom Debenture Hosts to inform you of the pick-up location to return you to Car Park 5.





FOOD & DRINK

A range of bars and restaurants are available to enjoy within the Centre Court and No.1 Court debenture areas, including fine dining, no reservation casual dining and self-service.

AFTERNOON TEA - A GREAT BRITISH TRADITION BY PAUL NEWMAN

Middle Sunday at The Championships will see the climax of the celebrations to mark the 100th anniversary of the opening of Centre Court, but debenture holders in particular might choose to spend a moment on the same day to remember another notable landmark. Sunday July 3 is also the 165th anniversary of the death of Anna Maria Russell, the seventh Duchess of Bedford.

What connection, you might wonder, is there between the daughter of Charles Stanhope, the third Earl of Harrington, and The Championships, which were first held in 1877, a full 20 years after her death? The answer is that the Duchess, who was a close friend of Queen Victoria, is credited with inventing what has become one of Wimbledon's finest traditions - afternoon tea.

As debenture holders in The Champions' Room and the Courtside Restaurant on Centre Court or The Renshaw on No.1 Court enjoy their free range egg mayonnaise and cress sandwiches or dark chocolate and tonka bean macarons, they might like to raise a tea cup to the Duchess, who decided in the early 1840s to take the frustratingly long wait between lunch and dinner into her own hands.

After initially requesting that bread and butter, cake and tea be brought to her room each day at 4pm, the hungry Duchess soon decided to make a social occasion of it and invited friends to join her. Before long, afternoon tea was established across the country as a fashionable event for which society women would dress up in elegant dresses and elaborate hats.

With The Championships rapidly becoming one of the social highlights of the summer in the latter years of the 19th century, it was not long before afternoon tea became an integral part of the occasion for those attending.

The earliest photograph of afternoon tea being taken at The Championships is from 1906. In those days tea was served on a lawn, on tables suitably dressed with tablecloths. The photograph shows the ladies wearing magnificent hats, many of them adorned with enough flowers and vegetation to fill a Wimbledon hanging basket. Headware was not apparently de rigueur for the men, though plenty of straw boaters are in view.

Lieutenant-Colonel Robert Durie Osborn, a former army officer who was also a writer and keen tennis player, described the ideal environment for a tennis afternoon tea in his book, *Lawn Tennis, Its Players and How to Play*, which was published in 1881.

"The scene should be laid on a well-kept garden lawn," Osborn wrote. "There should be bright warm sun overhead, and just sufficient breeze whispering through the trees and stirring the petals of the flowers to prevent the day from being sultry. Near at hand under the cool shadow of a tree, there should be strawberries and cream, an iced claret jug, and a few spectators who do not want to play, but are lovers of the game, intelligent and appreciative. If all these conditions are present, an afternoon spent at lawn tennis is a highly Christian and beneficent pastime."

Go into the players' restaurant at this year's Championships and the likes of Novak Djokovic and Iga Swiatek are more likely to be enjoying a bowl of gluten-free pasta and a smoothie than a slice of Battenburg cake and





a cup of Earl Grey, but there was a time when competitors happily availed themselves of the fare on offer to everyone else.

Nevertheless, sitting down to an afternoon tea was not always the best pre-match preparation, as Blanche Bingley-Hillyard, a six-times ladies' singles champion, discovered to her cost on a rainy day at The Championships in 1907. She had been due to play her singles semi-final, but was assured by the referee that he would schedule a ladies' doubles when conditions allowed.

"At that I went into the tea tent," she later recalled. "I must tell you what I ate, thinking of course that all chance of my playing in The Championship was over; two bath buns, six or seven slices of bread and butter, three or four cups of tea, six or seven biscuit cakes, two or three slices of other cake."

Having just finished her tea, however, Mrs Bingley-Hillyard was asked by the referee, "as a particular favour", if she would go on court and play her singles. Her opponent, Constance Wilson, who had presumably resisted the temptation to refuel to the same extent, won 6-2, 6-3.

Mrs Bingley-Hillyard would no doubt have appreciated the choices on offer at The Championships today, where afternoon tea has become such an important part of the Wimbledon experience, for spectators if no longer for players. At the Courtside Restaurant, for example, debenture holders can choose from eight different teas, four different sandwiches, scones with Wimbledon strawberry jam and Cornish clotted cream and a selection of five different tea cakes and pastries.

Of course, no afternoon tea at Wimbledon is complete without a bowl of strawberries and cream. Is there anything tastier than a Wimbledon strawberry, especially when you know it has been hand-picked that same morning at the Hugh Lowe Farm in Kent, which has been supplying the All England Club for more than 25 years?

The Malling Centenary strawberries, which replaced the Elsanta variety in 2015 to accommodate The Championships' move to a week later in the calendar, are grown with the specific aim of being at their absolute best during The Championships. Any strawberries that are not enjoyed on the day are made into jam and used in Victoria sponge cakes or served with scones and clotted cream throughout the year.

With similar care given to the choice of everything else on the menu for afternoon tea, it is no wonder that the figures totalling what is consumed during the Fortnight are mind-boggling. In 2019, which was the last year when The Championships were played without any restrictions on spectator numbers, guests at The Championships, in total, ate their way through 38,386 portions of strawberries, 11,277 litres of dairy cream, 1,895 kilos of clotted cream and 65,850 scones, all washed down with 267,121 cups of tea and coffee. Now that's what you call a good afternoon tea.

DEBENTURE INFORMATION POINT

If you have any questions upon arrival there is a central Debenture Information Point to the left of the Fred Perry statue.

This will be open from 10am until 2pm each day.

ACCESS TO DEBENTURE AREAS

To gain access to the debenture areas within Centre Court and No.1 Court, please show your mobile ticket. Debenture information lanyards will be provided at the entry points to the facilities upon displaying your ticket. Spot checks of mobile tickets will remain in place throughout the day.

DEBENTURE HOSTS

Our team of Debenture Hosts are there to assist you with any questions during the day. They are located at the Guest Arrival Hub, at the Debenture Information Point and throughout the debenture areas. They can be easily identified as they are dressed in Ralph Lauren uniforms and wearing name badges.



CLOAKROOMS

- Please bring any items you need with you in a bag measuring no more than 40cm x 30cm x 30cm.
- The Centre Court cloakroom is located inside the ground floor Fred Perry entrance.
- The No.1 Court cloakrooms are located inside the ground floor of The Renshaw and at the entrance to The Veranda restaurant.

WATCHING TENNIS

- Remember to switch your phone or tablet to silent and please ensure your flash is turned off.
- There are no supporting rails in tiered sections of the stands so please be particularly careful in these areas.
- You may only enter or leave a court at the change of ends or between matches, not during play.
- Please don't make any noise during a rally.
- Please applaud the players, but do not clap a net cord or double fault.
- Do not bring glass drinking vessels and uncorked bottles into the stands on court.



NEW FOR 2022

This is a very special year for The Championships as we celebrate the centenary of our move from Worple Road to Church Road and the opening of Centre Court.

Whilst reflecting on the past, this is also an opportunity to envisage what is to come in the next 100 years and we are pleased to share with you some of the changes in place this year.

Middle Sunday

Middle Sunday (Sunday 3 July) will not only feature as a permanent part of The Championships schedule for the first time, but will also be the focal point for the Centre Court centenary celebrations, with a special moment planned at 1:30pm to honour many of the historic feats witnessed on this iconic stage of world sport.

Platinum Jubilee

To mark Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee, the Finals Weekend coin tosses will feature two bespoke platinum coins, donated by the World Platinum Investment Council.

Ticketing

After a two-year absence, the Queue will return for spectators wishing to buy tickets on

the day, as will Ticket Resale, for those wishing to purchase returned Centre Court, No.1 Court and No.2 Court tickets, with all proceeds (net of VAT) going to the Wimbledon Foundation.

On the Court

A final set tie-break, with the first to 10 points with a two-point advantage, at 6-6 in the final set will be introduced this year, apart from Juniors and Wheelchair events, achieving consistency with the other Grand Slams.

The Quad Wheelchair draws have been doubled, to eight singles and four doubles and our Junior Championships expands with the addition of the 14&U draw alongside our existing 18&U draw, giving the world's best juniors the opportunity to compete on grass at an earlier age.

The Centre Court bowl has received a refresh, with a new central entrance for the players walking on court.

The umpire's chair has been redesigned for Centre Court and No.1 Court this year.

The umpires and linespeople will be dressed in new uniforms, delivered in partnership with Ralph Lauren, Official Outfitter of The Championships.





ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY

As part of our ongoing commitment to be Environment Positive by 2030, we have recommitted to the enhanced UN Sport for Climate Action Framework and encourage you to think 'Environment Positive every day' at The Championships.

Reusable Cups

We have a deposit scheme in place for hot and cold drinks, now sold in reusable cups which can be used on site again and again, year after year.

Reusable cups will be provided for a £1 deposit, the cost of which can be redeemed upon its return at food & drink outlets, or alternatively, the cup may be placed in charity return points around the Grounds, which will result in a donation to the Wimbledon Foundation.

WIMBLEDON FOUNDATION

The Wimbledon Foundation is the charity of The All England Lawn Tennis Club and The Championships.

During The Championships, the Foundation will be running activities from the Foundation Kiosk adjacent to Court 15 including Explore Wimbledon, an activity booklet for children. WaterAid will be showcasing the partnership with the Wimbledon Foundation in the Queue.

The Wimbledon Foundation has been active in supporting the Ukraine crisis response. A donation of £100,000 was made to the British Red Cross Ukraine Crisis Appeal; £50,000 to the DEC's Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal; and locally, £20,000 to the Association for Polish Family, an existing charity partner that has been collecting essentials to support the tens of thousands of Ukrainians crossing the Polish border.

The Foundation also invited local residents to nominate an inspirational young person from

the boroughs of Merton or Wandsworth to perform the pre-match coin toss at this year's ladies' and gentlemen's singles finals.

HSBC has proudly supported the scheme since 2008, supporting local causes in an extensive programme of community and charitable activities administered by the Wimbledon Foundation. During the course of the Wimbledon & HSBC partnership, Ticket Resale has raised £3.79m, including £1.89m from HSBC.

Despite the absence of the traditional Ticket Resale Scheme at The Championships 2021, HSBC continued its financial support and ensured that many of the charities that benefit from the Ticket Resale Scheme still received a donation - such as Give It Your Max, The Dan Maskell Trust and Tennis First.

We submitted our planning application last summer for the AELTC Wimbledon Park Project and anticipate a Planning Committee date to be confirmed in the coming weeks.

Commitment to our local community is one of our primary objectives for this project and benefits for them are integral to our plans. Further details can be found [here](#).

Of equal importance is our ambition to maintain our position as one of the finest sporting venues in the world, securing our future for the next 100 years and allowing us to maximise our financial support for the LTA to benefit tennis in the UK and the grass court season.

Central to the proposals are bringing the Qualifying Competition on site, improving practice facilities for competitors, opening a quality new Show Court, and enhancing the experience for spectators at the event.

- Please exit via Gate 12 for taxis to Wimbledon and the south. The taxi rank is on Somerset Road.

If you have a chauffeur car or private taxi booked

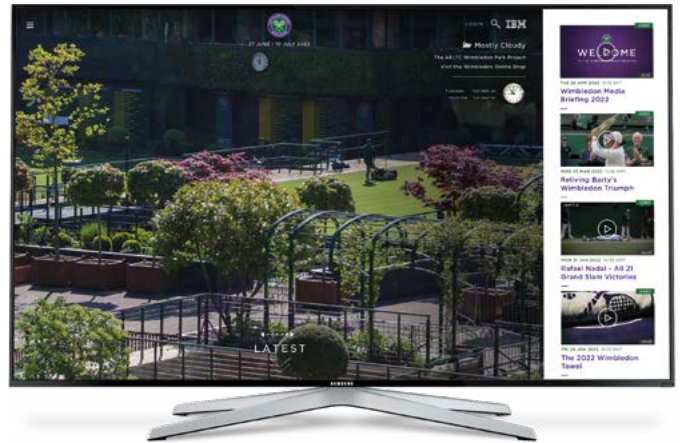
